1. I am satisfied the donor dog has been continuously resident in an Australian approved country and was not under any quarantine restriction during and between the first and last semen collection.
2. The donor dog was examined by a Government Approved Veterinarian or Official Government Veterinarian on the day(s) of semen collection and again 30 to 45 days after the date of the last semen collection, and was found to be healthy and free from evidence of infectious or contagious diseases (including venereally transmitted diseases).

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3. The donor dog:

- o has tested negative for *Brucella canis* using a rapid slide agglutination test (RSAT), a tube agglutination test (TAT) or an indirect fluorescent antibody test (IFAT) on a blood sample collected 30 to 45 days after the last semen collection; **AND**

- o has tested negative for *Leishmania infantum* using either an indirect fluorescent antibody test (IFAT) or an enzyme linked immunosorbent assay (ELISA) on a blood sample collected 30 to 45 days after the last semen collection; **AND**

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- has **EITHER** tested negative (less than 50% agglutination) at a serum dilution of 1:100 for *Leptospira interrogans* serovar Canicola using a microscopic agglutination test (MAT) on a blood sample collected 30 to 45 days after the last semen collection;

- **OR** has been fully vaccinated against *Leptospira interrogans* serovar Canicola at least 14 days before the first semen collection and the vaccination was current at the time of the last semen collection

- All the laboratory testing was conducted in an approved country and in a laboratory recognised by the competent authority of the country of export. Blood samples for laboratory testing were collected by a Government Approved Veterinarian or Official Government Veterinarian.
- A Government Approved Veterinarian or Official Government Veterinarian collected the semen identified above from the aforementioned donor.
- At the time of semen collection, each semen straw/cryovial was permanently marked with the animal's microchip number of the donor animal; the species and breed of the donor animal; and the date of semen collection.

1. The following documents must accompany the consignment to Australia and must have been signed and stamped by the Official Government Veterinarian in the country of export:
 - *Brucella canis* laboratory report
 - *Leishmania infantum* laboratory report
 - *Leptospira interrogans* sv. Canicola laboratory report (if not vaccinated)
2. Approved countries for the import of canine semen into Australia are:

3. A separate veterinary health certificate must be completed for each donor dog.
4. Any corrections made to the veterinary health certificate must be struck through, remain legible and be signed and stamped by an Official Government Veterinarian (correction fluid must not be used).
5. The owner/person in charge must give the Australian Government Department of Agriculture and Water Resources at least **three (3) days** notice of the consignment's arrival in Australia. This must be done by emailing or faxing the following information to the department's regional office located in the state/territory in which the consignment will first arrive in Australia:
 - date and estimated time of arrival
 - flight number
 - air way bill number
 - a contact phone number in Australia
6. It is the owner/person in charge's responsibility to provide all evidence required to demonstrate that the consignment meets the import conditions. All required documentation, including the veterinary health certificate, should be securely attached to the outside of the package and marked "Attention Department of Agriculture and Water Resources".
7. The owner/person in charge must make an appointment for the inspection of the goods and documentation by the department. The owner/person in charge must be present at the inspection. On arrival, the consignment will be subject to biosecurity control where it will remain until a biosecurity officer has completed the physical inspection of the consignment and all required documentation.
8. Consignments must be addressed to the Australian owner/person in charge and shipped as manifest cargo to the department's regional office located in the state/territory in which the consignment will first arrive in Australia. Transport via international mail is not acceptable.
